

## ELECTIONS 2024

A short overview of election parties and their views on spatial injustice.









Accelerate land reform and redistribution to reduce asset inequality and protect security of tenure – through effectively using provisions as guided by the Constitution in tandem to expropriation legislation.

Support food security through land reform.

Increase land availability near economic centers for youth, military veterans, and seniors

Fast-track land redistribution so that around 25% of farmland is now owned by black South Africans



Continue to build subsidized housing for vulnerable groups

Protect consumers by bolstering regulation of rental prices

Manage rapid urbanization through a sustainable model of compact, connected cities and towns, urban and rural areas, including the development of new cities and towns

Allow greater access to housing through accelerated land reform



Expand land ownership by prioritizing land reform in the budget.

Make use of available state-owned land for land reform projects, including housing, farming, and providing land access for South Africans

### LARD EXPROPRIATION

Protect private ownership of land as outlined in section 25 of the Constitution



#### ILLEGAL LAND OCCUPATION

Introduce legislation that will make it criminalize land invasions.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Protect property rights as enshrined in the Constitution



Amend the constitution to allow the state to be custodian of all land in South Africa

Limit land ownership by foreign nationals and entities

Limit land ownership, right to use and size of land for individuals

### LARD EXPROPRIATION

Expropriation of land without compensation by amending section 25 of the Constitution for equal redistribution in use



#### LAND REDISTRIBUTION

Accelerate land redistribution to allow 50% of Black persons access to land within a period of five years

Provide pre-settlement planning and post-settlement support to each person or community allocated land use rights, to ensure that the land allocated is fully utilized for its intended purposes

Introduce land development grants through the Land Bank, targeting specifically emerging Black farmers

#### LAND RESTITUTION

Do away with land restitution and instead prioritize land redistribution



Amend the Social Housing Restructuring Zones to include previously white owned areas to promote full integration and social cohesion by 2026

Address urban land poverty by releasing state land and abandoned buildings for housing purposes

Ensure that all private housing developments include mixed development for the benefit of the poor and middle class by 2026



Commission a full-scale land audit to focus on State land, redistributing it where necessary and supporting community projects to farm land commercially.


Finalise all outstanding land claims and reopen the window for further applications and claims.

Reallocate all unused land that is in the hands of the State, for the benefit of the poor.

Protect communal land

#### LAND EXPROPRIATION

Continue to support the policy of land expropriation with reasonable compensation.



Land is used as a populist political weapon. The myth that owning land creates wealth is rejected by the FF+.

Land claims should be finalised as soon as possible because it creates uncertainty which hinders development in the agricultural sector.

## ILLEGAL LAND OCCUPATION

...illegal occupations further harm the economy. Swift action, with accountability, should be taken to address the illegal occupation of land, buildings, parks, etc



The shortage of decent housing for the needy is resulting in extensive illegal occupation. It is to be expected given the level of poverty and economic decline



Strengthen access to security of tenure as well as the freedom to acquire, utilise, rent and sell property, including land

Protect all property rights and ensure that just and equitable compensation is paid for any expropriated land

## OCCUPATION

Ensure that illegal land invasions are met with full force of the law;



Eradicate the social housing backlog by promoting the development of ACDP Manifesto 2024 National and Provincial Elections affordable and inclusionary housing through the provision of community-owned self-help schemes;



Community-Driven Land Reform: Involve local communities in decision-making processes related to land reform.

The National Housing Act should be amended to remove the 8-year prohibition on selling government-subsidized houses, allowing owners to leverage their assets to generate capital.

#### ILLEGAL LAND OCCUPATION

An amendment to the Prevention of Illegal Evictions Act should be considered to address: -

- a. the issue of illegal land grabs ...
- c. jumping the housing queue



Cooperative housing models must also be encouraged in our country.

Finally, temporary shelters or transitional housing must exist to bridge the gap while permanent solutions are developed.



All publicly owned land, national provincial and local, must be used for land redistribution purposes, housing and farming projects.

#### AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Making more land available for subsidised and affordable housing in areas that are well-located, close to city centres.

Increasing the supply of Social and Community Housing





The UDM is not in favour of free-for-all land grabs and evictions and has long proposed for an Economic Indaba, where all stakeholders can congregate to discuss the macro economy, with land at the apex of the debate. This exercise will ensure that South Africans enter into a well-defined discussion and that they take ownership of the decisions made.

Address the 'Land Issue' through a fair and equitable process for all the country's citizens.

Focus our land justice efforts on land distribution, rather than land restitution.
